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7 year old female

Feb 2023

- Diffuse rash x 2 months
- Involves the arms, legs, chest and back.
- Spares the face and genital area.
- Patient was diagnosed with Strep throat and Scarlet fever at time of rash onset
- Very pruritic
- No improvement with hydrocortisone, triamcinolone, and Atarax
- No other family members have been ill or developed a rash
- No new soaps, detergents, and lotions

Medical History

• Impetigo

Surgical History

• None

Social History

• Lives with parents and 3 siblings

Family History

• Mother, sister, grandmother - eczema

Medications

- Mupirocin
- Tacrolimus
- Clobetasol 0.05% ointment
- Hydrocortisone 2.5% cream
- Loratadine
- Hydroxyzine

Allergies

No known allergies

- Prescribed clobetasol and tacrolimus
- Follow- up in 1 month
- No significant improvement --> start Dupilumab

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Before Starting Dupilumab







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March 2023

Dupilumab started



May 2023

Significant improvement after 1st dose

Improvement 2 weeks after 2nd dose but increased pruritus in 2 weeks leading up to next dose.

Pruritic dry patches on neck, occipital scalp, abdomen, chest, back

Palms and fingers with red, scaly, cracked areas of skin and multiple thickened and discolored fingernails

3rd dose is administered



Jul 2023

Worsening pruritus, redness, scaling days before 5th dose of dupilumab

Three Months After Starting Dupixent

Diagnosis

 Scabies preparation from bilateral hand scraping – identified mite eggs and mite fecal pellets

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Treatment

- Patient
 - PO Ivermectin and permethrin cream
 - Stopped Dupixent
- Parents
 - PO Ivermectin
- Siblings
 - Permethrin cream








Dupilumab-induced psoriasis shows enrichment of Th17 pathway characterizing immune polarization





Dupilumab-induced psoriasis shows enrichment of Th17 pathway characterizing immune polarization



Dupilumab-induced psoriasis shows enrichment in IL-1B and IL-36a/Y URs closer to those of generalized pustular psoriasis than plaque psoriasis
